#### WHO WE ARE



Child and Youth Protection Foundation (CYPF) is an autonomous not-for-profit, non-governmental, non-political, non-religious organization established in June 2008 by a concerned citizen of Nigeria. The organization strives to build a nation positively affecting the environment and attitude of children and youth.

We work with the government, religious organizations, schools, communities, and individuals to create an enabling environment and opportunity for the proper development of the Nigerian child and youth. We achieve this through advocacy, research, counseling, capacity building, awareness creation, educational support, community impact program, and mentoring/ leadership for children and youth.

Since 2008 when CYPF began operations, our interventions have expanded significantly. Some of our programs include Education Support Scheme (ESS), Personal Education Support Scheme (PESS), Girl Education Support (GES), Rehabilitation and Reintegration Program (RRP), Sensitization, Advocacy and Awareness Creation (SAAC), Development for Productivity and Positive Change (DPPC), Community Impact Programme (CIP), National Birth Certificate Registration (NBCR), Personal Hygiene Advancing Development for Girls (PAD4G), Project ME, Family Engagement and Strengthening Program, ICT for Girls and Boys 4 Change Campaign.

#### **CURBING CHILD MARRIAGE IN NIGERIA**

The Coalition of Nigeria Civil Societies on Ending Child Marriage with Funding from Girls Not Brides has been carrying out series of activities geared towards curbing Child Marriage in Nigeria.



### **FUND A PAD BANK PROJECT**



CYPF Started a project called "FUND A PAD BANK".

This project was done in four government secondary schools in the F.C.T.

access to sanitary
pads thereby
reducing period
poverty.

It also aims at increasing knowledge in issues surrounding menstruation. During the implementation of this project, CYPF was able to reach over 500 girls, empowering them with knowledge on issues surrounding menstruation.



#### CYPF LEADERSHIP TRAINING

CYPF team held a leadership training for students of Junior Secondary School Piwoye.



The series cut across many topics in leadership.



The students will use the knowledge aquired to be better leaders from now and the future. Various practical actvities were included in order to give the students practical knowledge of leadership

# YOUTH ADVISORY COMMITTEE TO THE EMBASSY OF THE NETHERLANDS

The embassy of the Netherlands inaugurated a youth advisory committee on April 27 th 2023. The committee constituted of different youths drawn from different sectors in the F.C.T.



This committee was inaugurated to get youths input on areas the embassy works on and to improve their relations with Nigeria. CYPF is represented in this committee giving inputs on Migration, Agriculture, Humanrights, e.t.c.

## FACILITATIONS

CYPF Facilitated a number of workshops for various organisations and partners throughout the year. The workshops were organised by various organisations in order to build the capacity of their staff and partners in relevant fields.



Some of which Include our Facilitation for The Federal Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development in collaboration with the ILO in August. The workshop is aimed at building the capacity of the Agricultural Officers on Child Labour.

Also, in our effort to curb bullying in schools, we held a capacity building workshop for the staff of Higher Ground International School, Abuja. The staff of the school were equipt with standard knowledge on bullying, team work and how to curb bulying in the school.

#### GIRLS NOT BRIDES; MOVEMENT BUILDING AND LEADERSHIP PROGRAM




CYPF was part of the GNB
