CYPF Nigeria Calls for Unified Action to End Human Trafficking

Abuja, Nigeria—July 30, 2025— In recognition of World Day Against Trafficking in Persons, the Child and Youth Protection Foundation (CYPF) joins the global call to action against the growing crisis of human trafficking. This year's theme, "Human Trafficking is Organized Crime—End the Exploitation," underscores the urgent need to confront the networks that thrive on the abuse and commodification of human lives.

Human trafficking remains one of the gravest forms of organized crime, with millions of women, children, and young people trapped in cycles of forced labor, sexual exploitation, domestic servitude, and modern-day slavery. It is a coordinated system fueled by deception, poverty, and impunity.

In Nigeria, trafficking continues to rob vulnerable communities of safety and dignity. With girls and young women often at the center of this crisis, there is an urgent need to strengthen prevention, prosecution, and protection efforts at all levels.

CYPF emphasizes that addressing human trafficking requires a multi-pronged approach that includes:

- Enforcing existing anti-trafficking laws and strengthening the justice system to dismantle trafficking networks.
- Providing survivor-centered support services, including rehabilitation, psychosocial care, and reintegration.

- Advocate for stronger policies and survivor protection systems
